Four Phases of Emergency Management

Prevention/Mitigation – establish safe working conditions, participate in planning committees

Recovery – after disaster serve as a liaison between community resources and those in need Preparedness – assist in establishing standard response plans, participate in skills, drills and exercises to evaluate response and effectiveness of the plan

<u>Response</u> – know your role, and where to find details on the plan





Prevention/Mitigation







Check your area for hazards or damage

Schedule periodic inspections outside the university schedule

Keep all entrances and exits clearly marked and free of obstruction




Scenario

Use your evacuation or shelter-inplace plans Do not panic, guide your team according to the plan you developed
